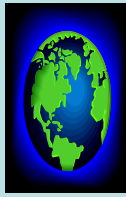

FOOD



- They eat: other raptor birds, mice, rabbits, hares, marmots, bobcats, snakes, wild goats, deer, foxes and wolves.
- In winter they eat dead animals.

WHERE DO YOU LIVE?



- They live in North America, Europe, Asia and North Africa.
- They live in pine woods.

WHERE DO YOU NEST?



- They nest in trees, rocky mountains or cliffs.
- They use branches.
- They can always use the same nest or build 2 or 3 in the same space.



MALE VS FEMALE



- The male is smaller. →
- Wingspan: 1'8 – 2m. →
- Weight: 2'9 – 4'5 Kg.



- The female is bigger.
- Wingspan: 2'3 m.
- Weight: 4 – 6'5 Kg.

CIRCLE OF LIFE



- Normally they lay 1-2 eggs.
- When they have 2 babies only the first one is who will live, the second one will die because parents do not feed it or the brother will expulse it of the nest.
- Incubation period: 41-45 days.
- The babies have white feathers.
- They can fly after 50-85 days.
- The parents feed the babies during 2-3 months.
- After 5 months the babies leave the nest.

HOW TO RECOGNIZE THIS BIRD?



- Their feathers are dark brown although they are golden in head & neck; they have white feathers in shoulders & the end of the tail.

OTHER INFORMATION



- It is very aggressive.
- The golden eagle can fly with a speed of 240km/h.
- They only have one mate.
- They can live more than 30 years.
- The golden eagles has two focal points: one to look in front & the other to look at the sides.
